

## CLARIFICATION FINAL JUN/SEN

## 1. Competition format as stated in the directives

- ➤ The first 6/8 countries\* in the ranking will qualify for the final. For this ranking, the points of the JUN & SEN teams will be considered in one global ranking.
  - \*8-10 registered countries = 6 countries in the final
  - 11 registered countries or more= 8 countries in the final
- ➤ 10 gymnasts (max) in the team, 4 of these perform (2 JUN + 2 SEN), 4 scores count for the team. In case your country has only one team in the competition, you are allowed to compete with 4 gymnasts of the same age category.
- Team result and award ceremony

## 2. Clarification concerning this competition format

- ➤ There will be 15 teams competing in the junior competition and 15 teams in the senior competition (based upon the registration list of April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2015). This means that 8 countries can qualify for the final.
- Countries with a registered junior <u>and</u> senior team:
  - The junior and senior team result from the qualifications will be added to define the qualifying list for the final.
  - If a country has more than one combined team (JUN and SEN), only one can qualify for the final.
- Countries with only one registered team (junior or senior):
  - From these countries only the junior and senior team with the highest result in the qualifications <u>can</u> qualify for the final (together they can 'form' a team for the final).
  - The qualification result from this best junior team and best senior team will be added to define their ranking in the qualifying list for the final.
  - If this combined score is higher than the 8<sup>th</sup> score of the countries with a registered junior <u>and</u> senior team, they are qualified for the final (and the initial 8<sup>th</sup> qualifier will not compete in the final).
- In case of a tie in points at any place in the qualifying list for the final, the ranking will be determined by the following criteria:
  - The combined team score with the highest sum of the total of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 highest apparatus team scores will prevail (so the lowest score of the 8 apparatus will not be counted).




Ranking after the qualifications of the countries with a junior <u>and</u> senior team in competition:

**Final ranking – all teams**: the total score of the combined team (=90) is higher than the score of the 8<sup>th</sup> qualifier, which means that this combined team is qualified for the final (instead of the initial 8<sup>th</sup> qualifier).
